WITTMAN: SPEND WISELY, AND SPEND LESS

- **Supporter of the Balanced Budget Amendment**
- **Introduced amendments to stop increases in annual spending bills**
- **Voted against the majority's \$18.25 trillion budget** for fiscal year 2010, which increased the debt limit by 9.2% – bringing our national debt to a record high of \$13.22 trillion
- **Voted for a budget that decreased spending and reduced deficits and our national debt**
- **Voted against \$1 trillion in new spending** for the health care overhaul
- **Voted for measures that will truly lower the cost of health care and give individuals the freedom to choose a plan to meet their needs**
- **Opposed the \$787 billion stimulus bill**, which has done little to help our economy recover and has not provided the job growth that was promised
- **Voted for targeted and timely measures to stimulate economic growth**
- **Opposed Wall Street bailouts**

THE STATE OF FEDERAL SPENDING:

- Without taking action, total federal spending will reach 50 percent of our Gross Domestic Product by 2054.
- Washington, DC consistently spent \$21,000 per household annually through the 1980s and 1990s. However, this year the projection is \$31,000 per household, on its way to \$37,000 by 2020.
- In 2010, the deficit will be equal to 62% of the economy – increasing to 79% by 2035.
